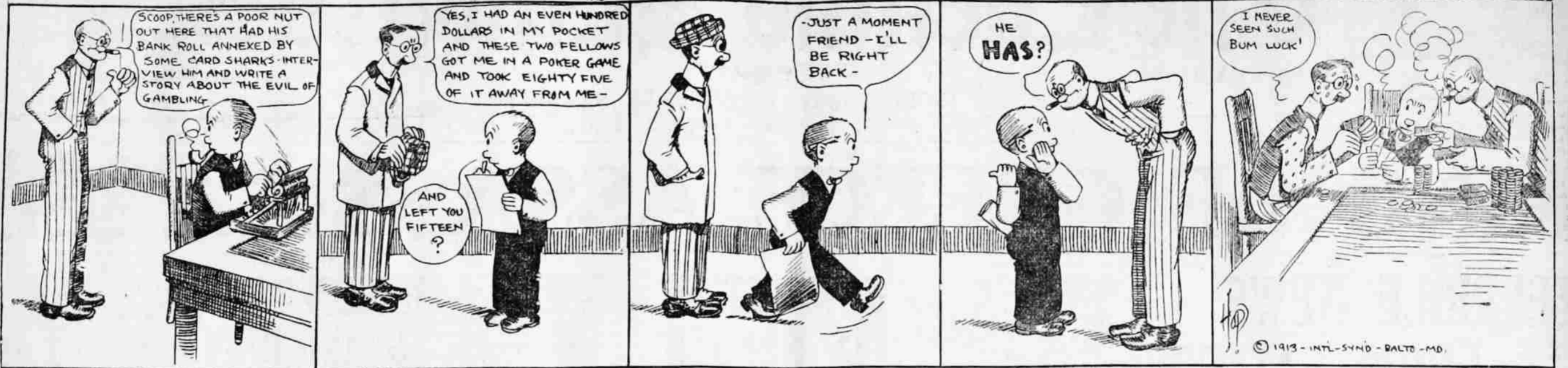

CLUB RULES NO BENEFIT

Restriction of Habits Reflection on Manliness of Players

Certain clubs within the last three or four seasons have attempted to restrict the habits of their players by inserting anti-booze and anti-cigarette clauses in the contracts.

Now, it strikes me that such sweeping restrictions are of little benefit either to the club owners or the players. It smacks too much of the police system and acts as a sort of flouting challenge to the players all season.
