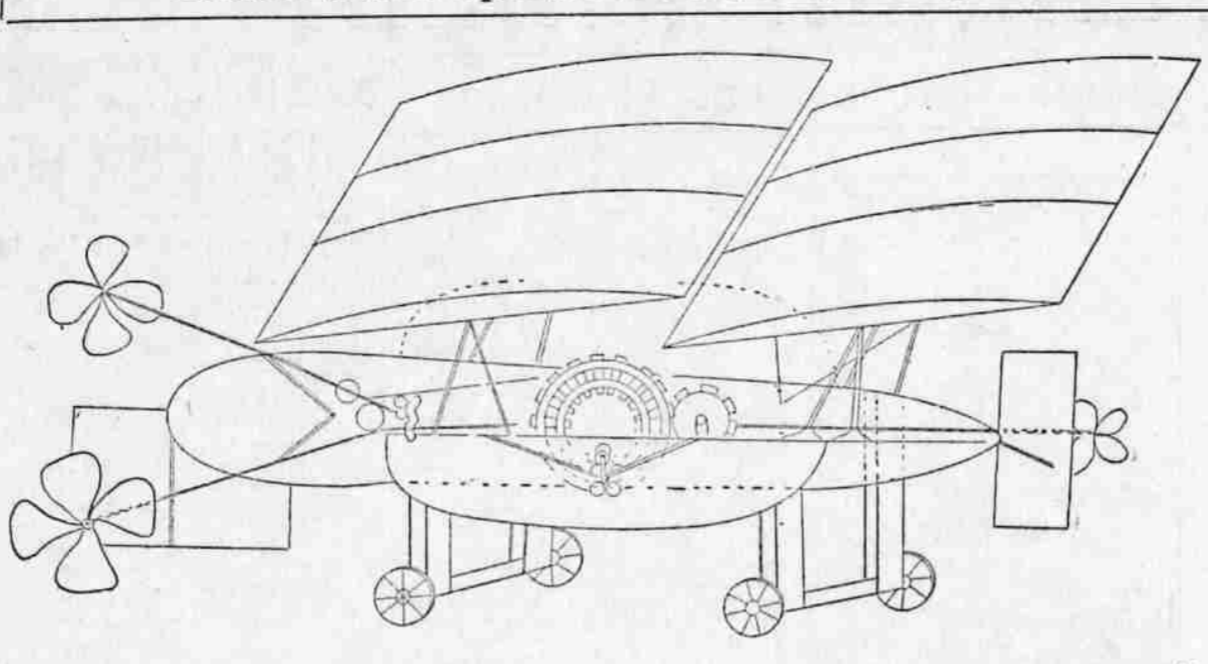

Gillett's Aeroplane Decidedly Original



Farman, father of the biplane, Wilbur and Orville Wright, Glenn Curtiss, Bleriot and other prominent in the aviation world may be forced to pay attention to P. E. Gillett, a Salt Lake resident, who has completed the working model of an aeroplane that is decidedly original.

The feature of the Salt Lake man's machine is the bird-like motion given by the balance planes, both of which are movable. The wings—if the term is permissible—are patterned much after the wings of a bird.

The foreign aviators and inventors have, as a rule, used a single propeller, pushing something after the arm of a windmill. Gillett's machine has three cone-like propellers, two on the sides at the wings and one in the center.

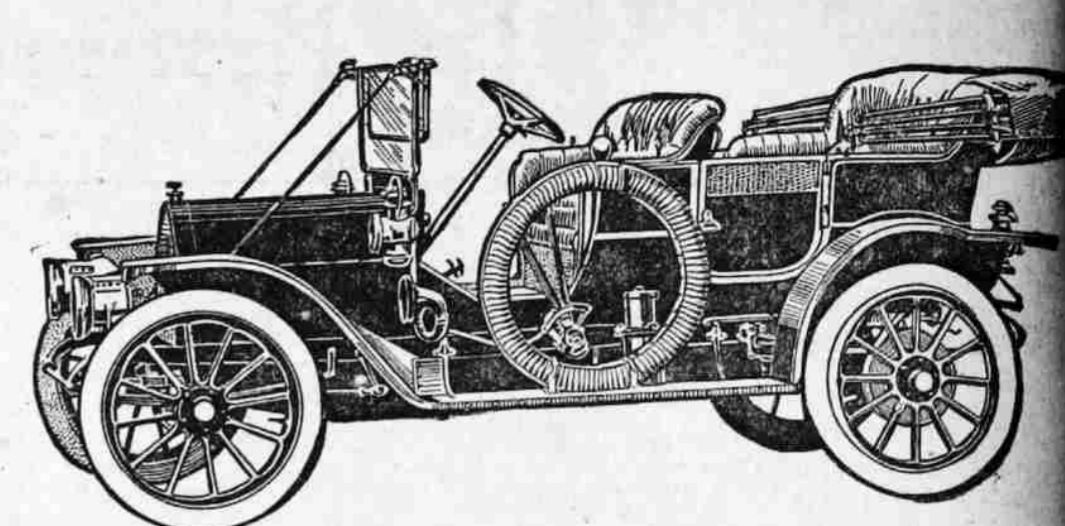

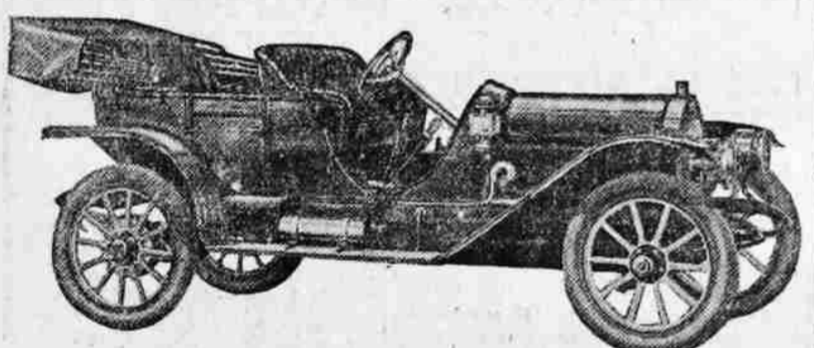
