Princess Was Horsewhipped.

Princess Louise of Saxe-Coburg, daughter of King Leopold, and who recently escaped from an asylum, is now living in Paris, and has written a letter to a socialist paper, in which she says she was horsewhipped by her husband because she would not expose herself before his friends while she was attired in a chemise. She declares that her husband, whom she found to be drunkard, broke into her bedroom, accompanied by three noblemen. Because she became angered at his conduct she was severely beaten by him. The princess complained to her father, whose relations with greenroom people in Paris and London, she says, did not give him time to trouble about his daughter. After asserting that her husband and father shut her up as a lunatic in punishment, she avers that she does not regret her flight with Lieutenant Count Matassich-Keglevitch. She adds:

"I am old, but my heart remains young and seeks affection. I do not want to be a princess any longer. I want to be a woman, respected and envied with love and regard. I have had enough of the duplicity and corruption of courts. All the courtiers of Europe are corrupt. They give me a feeling of nausea. To all who assert that I have acted badly and am a fallen woman, I answer that they lie. I now take what was scandalously stolen from me. I am the wife of Count Matassich-Keglevitch. I am free."

A Good Suggestion.

The Commercial Association of Danville at a recent meeting adopted the following resolutions: That Mr. E. F. Acree be requested to secure the co-operation of the Virginia State Board of Trade at the meeting of its Executive Council in Charlottesville, Va., September 17th, in bringing before and securing the passage by the next General Assembly, of a law authorizing, empowering and directing the judges of the Circuit and Corporation Courts of the, to sentence all criminals convicted of misdemeanors to work on the public roads, either in the county where sentenced, or in a county or counties nearest and most convenient to the county or corporation wherein such prisoner was tried and convicted. That Mr. Acree be requested to ask the co-operation of said Board of Trade in seeking to prevent by proper amendments to our convict laws, any new, or renewal of present prison contract for hiring out any convicts confined in our State penitentiary, to any corporation, firm, or individual for any purpose whatever.

Corset a Campaign Issue.

A campaign issue on corset lines is the programme by which the republican national committee counts on winning the 100,000 women voters in Colorado, Wyoming, Utah and Idaho. Chairman Cortelyou's literary bureau started the corset agitation as a political issue Tuesday by sending out a printed statement by W. A. Marble, executive officer of a corset company, declaring that protection has given the women better corsets than they used to have, and the tariff has improved their forms. Says the corset man:

"The tariff has enabled the American manufacturer to produce a better quality of corset. We now retail corsets at \$2 and \$2.50 each which are equal or superior to those we formerly imported. They are superior because they are adapted to the American waists."
