

## Georgia Has New Head

Governor Brown is Inaugurated With Simple Ceremonies.

Atlanta, Ga., June 26.—With quiet, simple ceremonies befitting the unostentatious nature of the man, Joseph M. Brown, was today inaugurated as governor of Georgia.

M. Brown was inaugurated into office today as governor of the state of Georgia. In carrying out his intention to have an inauguration of the simplest kind, consistent with the provisions of the state constitution, Governor Brown walked to the state capital dressed in a suit of Georgia-made brown jeans.

Governor Brown was chosen as the Democratic candidate at the primaries in June 1908, defeating Hoke Smith, the outgoing governor, who sought the endorsement of another term. The acrimony between Smith and Brown began when the latter was removed by the former from his office of railroad commissioner. It was asserted that Brown favored the railroads unduly.

Georgia's new governor is the son of Joseph E. Brown, governor of Georgia during the Civil War. He is a lawyer, farmer, merchant and political man, as well as the author of an epic poem.

## BOY SHOT AND BURIED HIS LITTLE BROTHER

### Coroner Believes Lad Was Alive When Interred.

Modesto, Cal., June 26.—Cecil Hopkins, twelve years old, confessed that he shot and buried his brother Theodore, six years old, and his statement strengthens the coroner's belief that the victim was buried alive on the hill where his body was found.

According to his story, Cecil killed Theodore while the parents were absent from home, after the boys had quarreled over their lunchbox. Cecil said he drove his brother from the house and shot him.

Fearing the consequences of his deed when the parents should return, he dug a grave in the sand. While digging the grave for the boy, Cecil said, Theodore moaned and stretched his arms. The cramped position of the arms, the nature of the wound and the fact that the child's mouth was filled with sand, add to the belief that the boy was buried alive.

The West Jersey & Seashore railroad has had some trouble assigning brakemen to man the freights that run to Maurice River from Manasquan to the mouth of the river, the brakemen fight for their lives with mosquitoes which settle down on them in clouds, and it is with difficulty that they can do their work.
