MEMORIAL SERVICE.

The memorial services conducted by Alva Aerie, No. 571, Fraternal Order of Eagles, at the Opera House last night brought together one of the largest gatherings ever seen in that place.

The stage, which was tastefully decorated with palms, flowers, and American flags, was filled with members of the order.

At the back of the stage a large tablet, encircled with a floral wreath, bore the name of those whose memory was honored: Joseph J. Roberts, William M. Glasgow, Samuel R. Wingfield, J. Frank Cook, Joseph O'Toole, George L. Simpson, Peter Sinclair and Wayne L. Garr.

The principal speakers were Representatives C. C. Carlin, of Alexandria, and Julius Kahn, of California, who is a member of San Francisco Aerie, No. 5.

The features of the programme were as follows: Funeral march by the Eagle orchestra, remarks by Worthy President E. J. Fleming, prayer by Chaplain Walter E. Jacobson, soprano solo, by Mrs. C. B. Bayly, jr., an address by Worthy Past President Thomas Chancery, a solo by Charles E. Meyers, an oration by Representative C. C. Carlin, selections by the orchestra, roll call of departed by Worthy Secretary Joseph H. West, assisted by a quartet composed of J. Gordon Phillips, J. E. Griffith, F. W. Smith and Lewis H. Oehler.
