THE ELECTRIC METER.
To the Editor of the Alexandria Gazette.
A few remarks relative to the electric meter would be acceptable to those who have these devices installed in their homes and places of business for illumination and power purposes at this time of the year, when daylight is shorter with the consequent increased meter bill. The electric watt-meter installed by the local illuminating company is of the Westinghouse or Fort Wayne type which measure the current consumption in the kilo-watts.

A small meter mounted on a jewel adjusts the dial pointers by means of a train of gears. The motor is in circuit with the lamps (load) and revolves at a speed proportionate with the current being used. This motor is calculated at the factory to measure an absolute known load by standard instruments (tried by a chronometer stop watch for such periods of test and calculated to one half of one per cent in accuracy.

When the meter is installed the local company also makes a test for accuracy. If only one lamp is turned on the dial will barely move but will increase in speed with every additional lamp turned on. A meter will and can be checked; the dial shows at any time the actual amount consumed. This being so it is easy to compare the amount paid monthly in dollars and cents as a check against what is considered exorbitant bills.

The rate for illumination being 7 cents per kilo-watt-hour. The kilo watt is the electric unit of capacity, and is the product of the volt amperes, the voltage being the pressure and the amperes being the flow or load. One kilo watt being equal to one thousand watts, the electric generator being of a certain watt capacity an ordinary sixteen (16) candle power lamp using fifty-six watts each hour. A few simple rules to read the wattmeter, read from right to left setting down the figures as read, read the figures on each dial which has been last passed, or is just covered by the pointer. Each dial reading depends on the reading of the one next to it on the right. Unless the one before it has completed a revolution, or passed the zero, the pointer which is being read has not completed the division upon which it may appear to rest, and still indicates the figure last passed. The consumer can subtract from the present reading the reading of last month, multiply the difference in kilo watt hours (reading) by seven cents the rate in this city, and you have the amount of the present bill in dollars and cents.

If the above remarks are applied a few times, the consumer can become familiar with his illuminating expense, and act accordingly. A satisfied consumer is a valuable asset to the local electric company and I am sure that they will at any time instruct the consumer in these readings so as to eliminate any dissatisfaction. The consumer must bear in mind that the meter in the meter will record all current being used, no matter how small the candle power of the lamp being used. Some people leave the lamp turned on forgetting to switch out the light, but the meter records faithfully. The wattmeter is a recognized standard instrument of precision, is used by the U. S. government in all laboratory tests.

The meter is the only just equitable manner of selling the electric current with justice to the consumer and the electric company at pre-determined rates.

If the above remarks are not clear to any of our citizens, the writer will give individual instruction in same.

"LEGALIZED" LYNCHING
Tiptonville, Tenn., bordering on Reel Foot Lake, which recently has been the scene of many stirring incidents, yesterday witnessed the "legalized" lynching of three negroes who were arrested yesterday morning for murdering on Saturday Special Deputy Sheriff Richard Burruss and wounding John Hall, a deputy sheriff.

The execution of the negroes was given a semblance of legality by a hurried "trial" arranged with the understanding that the men would be condemned to death as soon as the "trial" was over.

The negroes lynched were Marshall, Edward and James Sineback. They were captured yesterday morning and placed in jail at Tiptonville.

At the "trial" all of the evidence of those who had seen the killing was heard, and in an incredibly short time the "case" was given to the "jury," which in a few minutes "returned a verdict of guilty" and "fixed the penalty at death."

The "sentence" had barely been passed on the three negroes, when the mob, with a whoop and yell, swarmed into the courtroom seized the prisoners, rushed them to a large tree near the edge of the town and "duly executed the sentence of death" by hanging them, firing volley after volley into the air as the bodies were drawn up from the earth.
