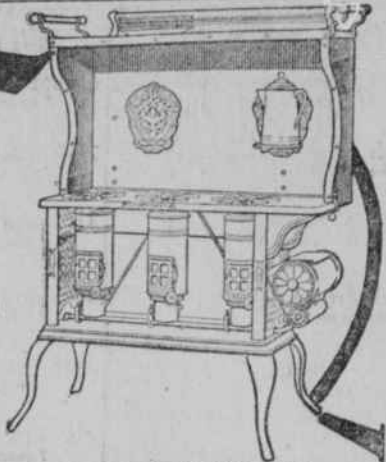

MONUMENT UNVEILED.

In the presence of Governor Fort, of New Jersey, Lieutenant-Governor Ellyson, of Virginia, and a distinguished gathering of citizens and veterans of both the blue and the gray, a monument commemorating the services of New Jersey troops at the "Bloody Angle," near Fredericksburg, was yesterday unveiled with appropriate ceremonies.

The unveiling of the monument was done by four young women, two representing New Jersey. Several changes had to be made in the programme at the last moment, the most disappointing one being the absence of Gov. Swanson, of the state, who could not be present. He was represented by Lieutenant-Governor Ellyson, who spoke at the unveiling at Boyle Angle.

Another disappointment was the absence of the commission named by Gov. Hoke Smith, of Georgia, to receive the battle flag of the Fourteenth Georgia, captured by the Jersey troops in this engagement. The flag ceremony was therefore omitted. A third mishap was the fact that Miss May A. Rowe, who was to have assisted at the unveiling, was prevented by illness from attending.

After the Bloody Angle ceremony luncheon was served and later the entire party drove to Salem Church, across country, where the second unveiling ceremony took place that evening.

Official.

AN ORDINANCE consenting to the location of a sidetrack or turn-out by the Southern Railway Company in Henry street, extending from the main line of railway in Henry street to and into the property at the northeast intersection of Cameron and Henry streets.

Whereas the Southern Railway Company, the assignee of the Washington Southern Railway Company, desires to locate and operate a sidetrack or turnout from the main line of railway in Henry street to and into the property at the northeast intersection of Cameron and Henry streets, in said City; therefore,

Be it ordained by the City Council of Alexandria, Virginia: First: That consent is hereby given to the location and construction of a sidetrack and turnout, the same being shown upon blue-print accompanying this ordinance, and described as follows:

Beginning at a proposed point of switch in the Henry street track of Southern Railway Company, two hundred thirty-five feet and ten-tenths (235.5) feet north of the point where the north building line of Cameron street intersects the centre line of the Henry street track, and measured along said track; thence

1. By a number six (6) turning to the left, having a radius of two hundred eighty-seven and nine-tenths (287.9) feet, a distance of sixty-one and five-tenths (61.5) feet to a point of compound curve; thence,

2. Continuing by a curved line to the left, through east half of Henry street, and having a radius of one hundred forty-eight and five-tenths (148.5) feet, a distance of forty-eight and five-tenths (48.5) feet to a point of reverse curve; thence,

3. By a curve to the right, continuing through the east half of Henry street, and having a radius of one hundred forty-eight and five-tenths (148.5) feet, a distance of twenty-seven (27) feet, to the east building line of Henry street; thence,

4. Continuing by the last mentioned curve through the lands of Armour & Company, a distance of forty-five and six-tenths (45.6) feet to a point of tangent; thence,

5. South 45° 00' west continuing through lands of Armour & Company, a distance of twelve (12) feet to the end and to maintain, use and operate the said sidetrack or turnout the same not to obstruct the drainage of Henry street, or of any street leading into Henry street, or the free and convenient travel thereon.

Second: The said Railway Company shall construct and maintain proper masonry basin at the point on the track side of said turnout where the same crosses the gutter on the east side of said Henry street and connect said basin with the catch basin or sewer at the northeast intersection of Cameron and Henry streets by a fifteen-inch vitrified clay pipe on a grade to be established by the Committee on streets and the City Engineer.

Third: At no time during the life of this ordinance shall the said railway company permit cars to stand or remain upon that part of said switch in said Henry street.

Fourth: The said track shall be constructed and maintained on the grades given by the City Engineer, and shall conform to the curb and sidewalk of Henry street where it crosses the said curb and sidewalk.

Fifth: The said track shall be plank laid over between the rails and two feet outside the same with plank four inches thick and the said track and planking shall be maintained in good smooth and sound condition, and the timber shall be renewed whenever so ordered.

Sixth: All of said work to be done under the supervision and direction of the committee on streets, and the City Engineer.

Seventh: The City Council reserves the right to alter, amend or repeal this ordinance.

Eight: This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage.
