Doubt you whether This she felt as, looking at me, mine and her souls rushed together? Oh, observe! Of course, next moment, the world's honors, in decision, Trampled out the light for ever. Never fear but there's provision Of the devil's to quench knowledge, lest we walk the earth in rapture!— Making those who catch God's secret, just so much more prize their capture! Such am I: the secret's mine now! She has lost me, I have gained her; Her soul's mine: and thus, grown perfect, I shall pass my life's remainder.
