OUR NATIONAL DEFICIT. OVER FIFTY MILLION DOLLARS ASKED FOR. (By Telegraph to Virginian-Pilot.)

Other amounts are: Temporary employes War Department, \$150,000; Signal Service for apparatus, war balloons, etc., \$165,000; balloon house at Fort Myer, Va., \$18,500; horses for cavalry and artillery, \$250,000; barracks and quarters, \$1,000,000; clothing, camp and garrison equipage, \$2,000,000.

The \$15,188,832 already enumerated for pay accounts, includes items of \$3,197,140 for pay of enlisted men; \$4,000,000 travel allowance to enlisted men on discharge; \$1,500,000 for clothing allowance on discharge; and \$4,524,715 additional 20 per cent. on pay of enlisted men.

C., Dec. 22.—The officials of the House of Representatives have struck a balance on the recent deluge of bills, showing that up to the recess the record stood: Total bills introduced, 5,015; joint resolutions, 95; simple resolutions, 65. Grand total, 5,175 measures of all kinds.
