Nearly Completed

Work is Being Pushed on Elkhorn Division to Eastern Kentucky.

The Manufacturer's Record says:

Two new coal routes are fast approaching completion. One is the extension of the Clinchfield railway from Dante, Va., to Elkhorn City, Ky., and the other is from Winchester to Irving, Ky., on the Louisville & Nashville railroad.

The fast approaching completion of the Clinchfield railroad as originally planned directs attention to the work which is being done in its behalf, looking to the construction of an up-to-date coal-handling plant on tidewater at Charleston.
