The dream, as it were, loses all its horror to him, for he is looking into the face of his Master and with a peaceful, calm expression upon his face we hear him saying, "Lord, receive my Spirit," and he awakes forgetful of the recent accident, for he is home at last with Jesus. His last two years were spent as an agent for the Singer Sewing Company. Faithfully, too, but even in that work he always found and used the opportunities of working in his Master's vineyard.

Brother Rose was married to Miss Lydia Robinson of Fairview, Va. To this union were born seven children, three of whom preceded him to the better land. One son and three daughters remain to comfort and care for their widowed mother. The Baptist church has lost an active,

faithful member, and the other Churches will keenly feel this, for he was interested in the salvation of souls for the person's and Jesus' sake rather than church domination. Oh, how the loved ones of his own hearthstone, and his beloved sister, Mrs. John Brotherton, of Appalachia, must miss him! None but God, the Father, can know of the heartaches there. Grief, nor pain, nor any sorrow, rend thy heart to Him unknown. He today, and He tomorrow grave sufficient gives His own. Wife, children, sister and friends, let us not grieve, because Brother Rose has gone where his not over strong body and crippled hands can rest, but let us rejoice that he so lived on earth that for him to live was Christ—to die was gain.

Bill to Protect the "Dry" States

Washington, June 26.—A constitutional amendment, designed to protect "dry" States, was introduced in the senate by Senator Dillingham, of Vermont.

Instead of prohibiting the sale for beverage purposes of intoxicating liquor in the United States as the Hobson-Sheppard constitutional a m e n d m e n t does, the Dillingham amendment merely prohibits the transportation into any State for sale or for use for any purpose contrary to the laws of such State. It purpose is similar to the recent enacted Kenyon laws, but it would remove all question as to the validity of the legislation embraced in those measures.
