Towns in Danger. Sanitary Engineer Shows They Are Drinking Polluted Water and May Expect Typhoid.

Lexington, Va., May 15th.—That a number of Virginia towns are drinking highly polluted water and are in danger of serious epidemics of typhoid fever at any time was the statement made yesterday before the Virginia Public Health Association by Richard Messer, the sanitary engineer of the State Board of Health.

Illustrating his address with charts based on his own surveys of the cities and towns of Virginia, Mr. Messer showed that a number of the towns were taking their drinking water from water-courses and water-sheds that were constantly polluted. In such towns, he said, it was only a question of time before there would be a serious outbreak of typhoid fever that would menace the lives of all citizens.

Mr. Messer gave the names of the towns with a detailed account of the water-supply of each.

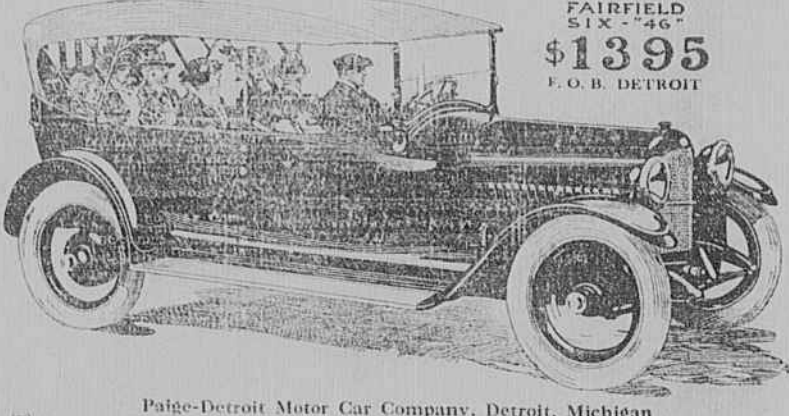
