The result of the game was a complete surprise to most base ball critics owing to the fact that Appalachia had greatly strengthened their team in the last few weeks. Bibb, who has the reputation of being one of the best pitchers in the league, did not have his usual line of stuff, Big Stone Gap touching him for a total of sixteen hits, which netted nine scores. After the fifth Bibb settled down and pitched a splendid game. Appalachia's two scores were made in the fifth when Bailey singled and Games followed with a home run drive over the center field fence.

Wright hurled a masterful game for Big Stone Gap, allowing five hits, and got his usual extra base hit, which was a double. Potter, Skelly, Jones and Norton featured at the bat for the visiting team, getting a majority of the hits. Hall, for Appalachia, made two sensation catches in left field which looked good for three base hits. There was a total of eight bases stolen by the Gap team.
