#### Automobile Party Has Narrow Escape

Sunday morning an accident happened between here and East Stone Gap, when Peter Wolfe, who was taking a crowd to the Sunday School Rally at Big Spring Church, lost control of his machine on a sharp curve where the course of the river was changed when the pike was constructed, and the car jumped over a steep bank, turning a complete somersault and landing right side up in the river. Dr. W. G. Painter, who was driving his car close behind, assisted in the rescue work. Only one or two in the party were slightly injured, but it was considered a miracle that any of them escaped.

The car ran along the bank, which was very steep, for a distance of about thirty feet, when it hit a rock and turned completely over. The fact that the top was up probably saved some of the party from being thrown out. The car was removed from the river and brought back under its own power. The wind shield was broken and the top torn up was the only damage to the car.

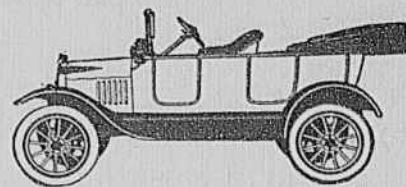

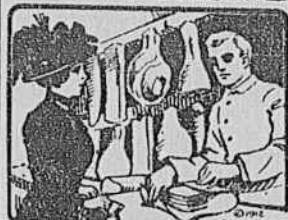
