The food administration has issued an interesting statement in which we can see the result of the food economies effected by our wheatless and meatless days. July 1st, 1917, the wheat available for export was estimated at 20,000,000 bushels. In the period from that date to June 1st, 1918, our shipments of wheat to the allies amounted to 120,000,000 bushels. The largest shipment of beef products in any one month during this period has been 87,000,000 pounds, against the ordinary export of pork in one month reached 308,000,000 pounds. These supplies have been used to help feed the armies of France, Belgium, England and to some extent Italy. Some of these foodstuffs have also been used for the civilian pop-

ulation of these countries. It is a splendid record and shows that the care and self-sacrifice of its people have made the United States equal to its great task.
