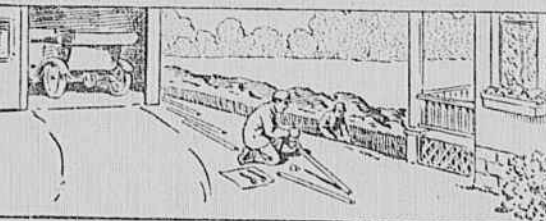
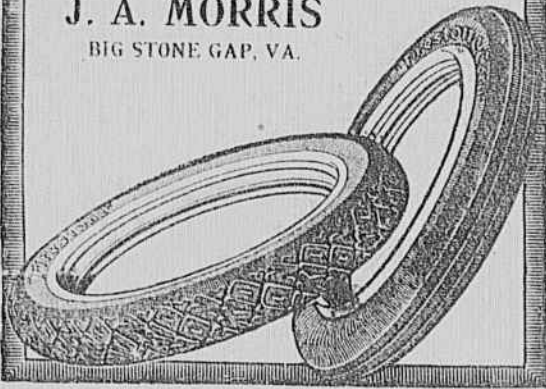

### RADFORD NORMAL NOTES
