### BAPTIST RURAL CHURCH PROGRAM

Dr. Joseph T. Watts, Sunday school secretary of the Baptist State Mission Board, states that his board is working out the most comprehensive plan for reaching the rural churches of Virginia with modern Sunday school methods that has ever been put on in any state of the south.

In 1915 a total of one hundred and thirty institutes were held in which normal instruction was given officers, teachers and prospective workers in Baptist Sunday schools. In 1919 two hundred and fifty such institutes were held, touching practically every section of the state. Now the Baptist board is planning to hold five hundred institutes during the present year, principally between April and October.

Baptist churches are organized into twenty nine district bodies, called associations, and a representative of the Sunday work has been appointed for each of the districts. In some of them two or more workers have been appointed. In all there will be forty one field workers, nine of them women and the rest bright young men from Richmond College and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.

The board at Richmond makes engagements in advance for all the workers employed in the rural campaign, and each of them is expected to hold a minimum of twelve institutes if they work three months and more if they are employed for a longer period or for full time.

The headquarters staff consists of Dr. Joseph T. Watts, secretary; Rev. Frank K. Poole, Sunday school field secretary; Prof. J. C. Hockett, southwestern field worker; Miss Mattie Guthrie, elementary worker, and Miss Marian e. Hardeste, eastern field worker.

The Baptist State Mission

Board is now engaged in gathering information concerning the needs of all of the Virginia fields, under the form of a survey.—this will be completed by the first of July and made available to the district associations for their consideration in meetings to be held commencing in that month.

### Aged Lady Dead.

Freezing, Va., April 2.—Mrs. Elizabeth Mullins, said to have been 97 years of age, died at her home four miles east of here, Thursday. She was doubtless the oldest person in the county. She is survived by a sister, Mrs. Malvina Stanley, who is 90. The deceased had been blind about 10 years ago, leaving no issue, since which time she has kept to herself, homestead managing her affairs so as to live upon her resources.
