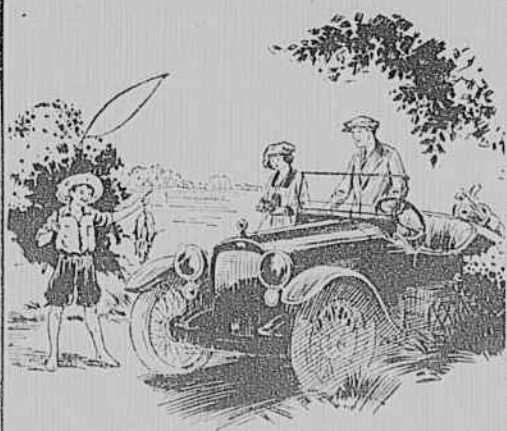

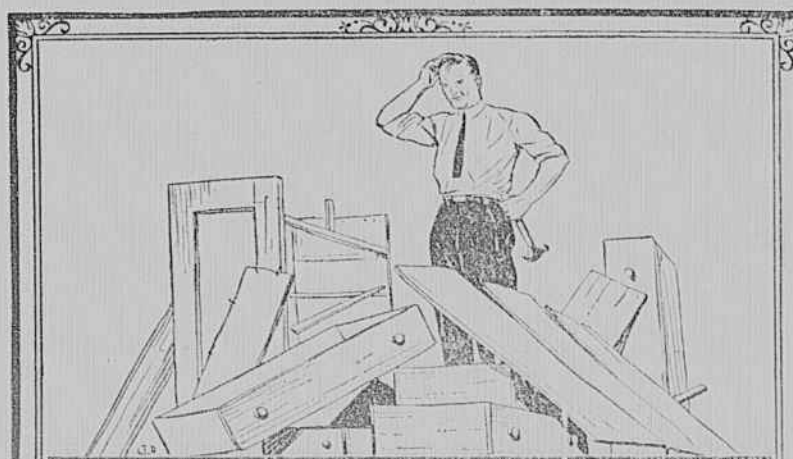
Henry McCormick, of Richmond, Ky., spent last week in the Gap.
