**U. S. TITLE TO FOE
SHIPS MENACED**

Paris, June 13.—America's title to interned German ships appears today to be somewhat endangered. Complications in the shipping question, which appeared easily solvable six weeks ago, are tying up the final award to America. These disputes involve France, Italy, Japan, and Brazil.

Italy apparently is providing the chief obstacle, though without furnishing any reason. Signatures of the British and French were obtained several weeks ago to an agreement for the ships seized in her ports. Italy also announced her readiness to sign, but when it came to affixing her signature she always held off on some pretext or another without denying the propriety of America's position.

France signed the agreement, contingent on being allowed to buy a number of German ships interned in Brazil. But Brazil asked all cash for the ships, while France wanted to pay part cash and part in securities, Japan is withholding her assent until arrangements are made for her to obtain a certain amount of tonnage from America, which is expected to be easily arranged. Great Britain, meanwhile, is standing on the agreement, despite the protest of British commercial interests.

Portugal is now presenting claims for a part of the German navy as reparation for her naval losses. The general understanding is that Portugal's losses were limited to a few mine sweepers, but her claims include light cruisers, destroyers and various other craft.

FIREMEN THREATEN STRIKE

Jacksonville Is Offering \$5 Per Day To Men Who Will Remain Loyal Jacksonville, Fla., June 13.—With Fire Chief T. W. Haney in charge of a recruiting office for the fire department and many men applying for positions, indications are that the fire men's strike which has been ordered will not affect the efficiency of the local fire-fighting organization. The city is offering emergency firemen \$5 a day and assuring permanent positions to men who qualify as efficient and loyal.

Local underwriters Wednesday pronounced their confidence in the ability of the city to handle the situation, and declared there would be no cancellation of insurance or increase in rates.

**ONLY THREE OPERATORS
STRIKE IN BALTIMORE**

Baltimore, June 13.—Three telegraph operators in Baltimore obeyed the national strike order Wednesday. That's all that happened. Business went on as usual, except for a slight delay in messages over the Postal Telegraph Company's wires. Baltimore scarcely knew there was a telegraphers' strike.

The three operators who quit were members of the Postal Company's forces. J. A. Vert, local manager for the Postal, said they were extra hands, recently brought to Baltimore from the South, and the fact that they walked out didn't make a bit of difference to the local office.
