**SENTENCED TO 15 YEARS**  
**Slayer Confessed Crime Soon Afterward, But Was Forced to Serve Term in Virginia**  
 Reading, Pa., June 13.—For the murder of Gordon Kauffman, of this city, almost eight years ago, Joseph Winsay, alias Joseph H. Carey, Wednesday was sentenced to 15 years in the Eastern Penitentiary, having entered a plea of guilty of murder in the second degree. His pals, John Lutz, Chester Lewzewski and William Schmitz, whom he exonerated from blame in the shooting and who pleaded guilty to two charges of burglary in which Winsay also figured, were sentenced to from 5 to 10 years on each indictment, to be served successively.  
 The murder of Kaufman came as a climax to a series of burglaries that aroused the city and county in the fall of 1911. On November 10, 1911, about 4:30 in the morning, Winsay, Lutz, Lewzewski and Schmitz entered the baker shop of Kauffman and asked for some apple pies. After they received the pies they crowded toward the door, preparing to leave without paying for them. Mrs. Kauffman stamped on the floor to attract the attention of her husband, who was in the basement working. He rushed up the cellar steps leading to the sidewalk, but before he could utter a word a revolver shot silenced him.  
 The quartet fled and the crimes ceased. Nothing was heard of the four until a few days afterward, when four young men were arrested at Petersburg, Va., for highway robbery, and because of their youth, were sentenced to 12 years in the penitentiary. Sheriff Merkel, then county detective, went to Richmond and obtained confessions from the four that they were guilty of the Kauffman murder and of various hold-ups.  
 Numerous attempts were made to extradite them, but the Governor of Virginia refused to consider the matter. Last March they were pardoned by the Governor and immediately brought to Reading. Winsay shouldered the blame for shooting Kauffman, while the others confessed to burglaries at Hainleys hotel, Sinking Spring, and at Fritz's hotel, Angelica. At the latter place they made the proprietor open his safe at the point of a pistol.
