A gentleman from the capital city fairly goes into raptures in relating the meeting he had with the "Prince of Albemarle," as he christened this daring and dauntless hero of a hundred desperate cavalry engagements in the civil war. It was after it had become known that the President had named him for a brigadier-general.

During the interview with our enthusiastic narrator a newly appointed officer came up and asked Rosser where he was going to have his uniforms made. "They will cost you a lot of money," said he. "I have had six suits made and they cost me seven hundred dollars."

"I will only need," responded Rosser, "a flannel shirt which I can buy here anywhere on the avenue; a pair of shoulder straps, and a string or piece of braid around my hat to designate that I am an officer."

"You will have to get a fine horse, General," continued the interlocutor. "General Butler has had a four hundred dollar black stallion presented to him, and other generals have secured fine horses."

"Well," replied Rosser, "I have some good stock down on my farm; out from what I can learn a horse will not be the suitable thing in Cuba. I think a mule will be best, and it is my expectation to ride a mule."

**ROBERT E. LEE.**  
The London Spectator, in a review of Dr. Henry Alexander White's "Robert E. Lee and His Southern Confederacy," pays a worthy tribute to the hero of the lost cause, and one which warms the heart of the southern veteran. It says:

"Englishmen of all parties will always feel a greater interest in Lee than in Grant, even though politically the 'r'-sympathies may be with the Union. No more truly heroic figure than Lee exists in modern history, but it must be admitted that, like Washington himself, he was essentially of the aristocratic type. There is a singularly pathetic side to his career, which arises from the fact that this brilliant and devoted son of Virginia was, if not at heart a unionist, yet who saw all the evils in secession and in slavery, which he was doomed to spend his grandest efforts in upholding. In his private life Robert E. Lee was everything that we understand by the term 'gentleman,' and as such he might meet with defeat, but never with disgrace. He was a profoundly religious man, of the high Puritan type. After Petersburg and Appomattox, when he exclaimed to his beaten soldiers: 'Men, we have fought through the war together. I have done my best for you. My heart is too full to say more'—down to his later semi-retired life as the worthy president of Washington College, we note in every recorded word or action a man of whom we, as well as our American kinsfolk, may be proud, and as a true Anglo-Saxon, worthy of the type of Cromwell and Hampden."

## NOTICE TO CITY TAX-PAYERS.

COLLECTOR'S OFFICE  
June 18, 1898.  
Notice is hereby given that the tax bills for 1898 are now in the hands of the collector. The attention of parties interested is respectfully called to the following extract from the revenue bill of that year:  
"Upon all bills paid in full by the 1st day of July, 1898, the Collector of Taxes shall allow a discount of ten per cent. and on all bills paid by the 1st of September, 1898, he shall allow a discount of five per cent., and on all bills not paid on the 1st day of December, 1898, there shall be assessed and collected a penalty of five per cent. upon the amount of said bills, and on all bills remaining unpaid on the 1st day of June, 1899, damages at the rate of six per centum per annum shall be paid."  
Tax-payers would do well to call and pay at once in order to avoid the rush and crowd usually present on the last days in which the discount is allowed. Bring a list to make sure you get bills for all your property, as the collector will not be responsible or allow the discount after the time fixed by law.
