Central Vermont Railroad.

Trains leaving Barre for White River Junction, Boston, New York and all intervening points at 8:35 a. m., 12 m. and 12:55 a. m. Local train for White River Junction and Windsor and intermediate stations leaves at 5:30 p. m.

Trains leave Barre for Burlington, St. Albans, Rouses Point and Greenburg at 8:25 a. m. and 3:05, 5:30 and 12:01 a. m. Trains connect at Essex for points on Rutland road and the 4:30 connects with New York trains for Montreal and points west leave Barre at 4:00, 5:30 and 12 m.

For Williamstown leave Barre 1:21 and 4:30 p. m. Leave Williamstown at 7:30 a. m. and 2:30 p. m.

Montpelier & Wells River Railroad, Commencing Sept. 30, 1901.
