Post Office Burglars' Good Haul.

Rochester, N. Y., June 20.—Burglars broke into the post office at Charlotte during the night, realizing something more than \$300 from their haul. Dynamite was used on the safe to blow off the outside door; then another charge was fired in the safe's interior. People in the village were awakened by the explosion, but thought the sounds came from fireworks at the beach. The robbery was not known until morning. The post office was almost completely wrecked. No trace of the perpetrators has been found.

Smoked in Powder Magazine.

Charlevoix, Pa., June 20.—Three Slav miners were fatally burned by a powder explosion in the home of Nate Glazes, one of the victims in the mining settlement of Twilight. Three cases of powder were in a back room of Glazes' house. He, Mike Zyrtu and Simon Jnur were in the room smoking their pipes when the explosion occurred. None of the victims can recover, all being burned from head to foot.

Want Memorial Day Changed.

Nagars Falls, N. Y., June 20.—Among the resolutions adopted at the state encampment of the G. A. R. was one urging the national department to have the date of Memorial day changed to the last Sunday in May or the first Sunday in June, the idea being that by the change of date the growing tendency to make a holiday for sport, etc., of Memorial day would be done away with.
