WRIGHT AGAIN IN COURT.

Prosecution of the Accused London Promoter Reverts.
 London, Aug. 25.—The proceedings in the case of Whitaker Wright, the company promoter, were resumed in the Guildhall police court. The attendance of the public was not large. Wright appeared to be calmly confident. In formally opening for the prosecution Horace E. Avory, senior counsel for the treasury, described the circumstances of Wright's departure for New York and his extradition and said the broad facts of the prosecution's case were that Wright, being managing director of the London and Globe, British-American and Standard Exploration companies, used these names as suited his purpose for Stock Exchange speculations and engaged wholly in fictitious transactions.

Counsel added, as evidence that Wright controlled all the financial operations of the companies, that the much discussed speech of the late Lord Dufferin at a shareholders' meeting was written by Wright. Mr. Avory concluded with saying that the losses of shareholders in the capital of the three companies amounted to \$25,000,000 and that of \$39,575 shares of the London and Globe Finance corporation originally held by Wright he appeared only to possess 2,500 shares at the time of the collapse of the concern.

Today was occupied with the examination of witnesses in support of Mr. Avory's contention that Wright swelled the assets and diminished the liabilities of the companies by paper entries, transferring items of one company to another just before shareholders' meetings. The proceedings were then adjourned.

Chicago's Restaurant Strike.
 Chicago, Aug. 25.—Only a small number of the waiters and cooks employed in several downtown lunch rooms struck in the first move of the waiters and cooks' union to renew the fight against the Chicago Restaurant Keepers' association. In a general statement issued by the cooks and waiters the reason assigned for the action is alleged discrimination on the part of the arbitration board in its decision relating to the question of hours and wages.
