To Physicians and Household

Act No. 175 of the Laws of 1919 makes the following provisions: 1. All communicable (contagious) diseases must be reported to the District Health Officer by the physician in attendance, if there is one, otherwise by the head of the family. 2. Physicians are required to quarantine families attended by them in which a case of communicable disease is known or suspected to be present. 3. Heads of families in which a communicable disease is known or suspected to be present, and where no physician is in attendance must quarantine their own houses. 4. Quarantine will be raised only by the District Health Officer on a written certificate from a physician that the family is in safe condition for release. 5. All burial permits will be issued by town clerks. Quarantine cards and notices may be obtained at the office of the town clerk and from selectmen. These provisions are effective July 1, 1919. Vermont State Board of Health.
