**ABOUT THE STATE**  
Happenings of Interest From Different Sections.

Rolla Ryan of Fairfax has been bound over to county court for threatening to kill his father.

Selectman Arthur Merchant of Pownall had a narrow escape from death Monday when he was buried by the caving in of a large bank of earth. He was nearly dead when shovelled out and will be confined to the house for several days.

The front cover of the August Country Life in America is from a photograph by Miss Katherine Bingham of St. Johnsbury. The picture was taken in Waterford and is a charming bit of scenery with some graceful white birches in the foreground.

During the storm Saturday night, lightning struck the roof of the Catholic church in Lyndonville and went inside, tearing off a little of the plastering. A bit of the electric wire came in contact with John Nash's wire fence where three or four chicks were roosting and they were found dead the next morning, one of them having perched with nearly all its feathers.

St. Johnsbury's new fire truck is now in full commission as it was accepted by the trustees Monday. It was given a final tryout Monday forenoon, about the streets and up and down some of the steepest hills. With five men and its full equipment of apparatus it weighs 9,500. On Monday's trial run to St. Johnsbury Center with this load it registered 50 miles an hour the greater part of the way.

During the severe storm early Sunday morning, lightning struck a tree at the corner of Peter Fountain's home in Milton, and divided, plowing up the earth toward the road and also to the corner of the house, where it entered the cellar, splintering a sleeper and tearing up boards in the floor and breaking two legs of the stove, going out through a room where Miss Agnes Fountain was sleeping. It tore off the plastering under a picture and burned the corners of the picture frame. Miss Fountain was stunned, but soon recovered. She has a burn on her left side the shape of the tree trunk and the spreading roots.

Judge Charles Rogers of Lyndonville died Sunday, following a shock of paralysis. Judge Rogers was born in Alton, N. H., in 1823, and moved with his parents to Wheelock in 1828. From there he went to St. Johnsbury and in 1830 moved to Lyndonville, where the rest of his life was spent. He had always been very active in public life. He was representative from Wheelock in the Vermont legislature in 1854, 1861, 1862, 1880, 1882 and 1888; senator from Caledonia county from 1872 to 1876; associate judge of Caledonia county from 1868 to 1870; a trustee of the state reform school from 1872 to 1876 and chairman of the board in 1875 and 1876. He was a competent surveyor whose services were much sought for. Since he was 85 years of age he worked continuously for some weeks surveying in both Newark and Lyndon, which was a remarkable record for a man of that age. He had also settled a number of estates and held many town offices of responsibility in Wheelock, having served as town clerk, treasurer, agent, lister, superintendent of schools and selectman. For fifty years in succession he held the office of justice of the peace and was frequently called upon to act as a trial justice.
