HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM
DIFFERENT SECTIONS

A red-headed woodpecker was seen in Brattleboro recently, the first time in 16 years that this species of bird had been seen there.

When Hooker Winchester made a trip to his potato field in Guilford, Saturday, to cover up several rows that he had left uncovered, he found that about 40 hills had been eaten by deer. Their tracks were plentiful.

The amount received by the city of Burlington this year for liquor licenses was \$17,400. This will be forwarded to the state treasurer.

A mirrorgraph entertainment was given in the Willard mill in Townsland, recently, that being the only place in town with electric lights, which were necessary for the working of the machine.

Mrs. A. B. Gardner has sold 20 acres of land in Pownal to E. C. Chamberlain of North Carolina, who is said to have acted for New York parties. The purchasers will manufacture stone products and will employ about 25 men. Trap rock for road building and pulverized stone for paper manufacture will be produced.

The four-year-old son of Peter Blake of Bellows Falls was badly hurt a few days ago when a basket of wood which was being raised by a pulley to a second story, gave way and fell on his head. The little lad is at the hospital suffering with a fractured skull. His recovery is expected.

Walter Murray of Warren has been exhibiting a curiosity lately—a chicken with two bodies, four feet and one head. It had one perfect body and to it was joined a body with no head but with two feet. The chicken lived but a few hours.

While digging in his garden in Rutland, A. C. Mason unearthed a cannon ball about two inches in diameter and weighing two pounds. It is supposed to be a Revolutionary relic, as it was corroded, and the supposition is that it dropped from some vehicle during transportation in the Revolutionary period.

The Stratton mountain tower is to be dedicated at West Wardsboro June 25.

Walter Monroe, employed in the Windsor Machine shop, was caught in the machinery one day last week and all his clothing stripped off, owing to the high speed of the machine. He was also badly bruised, but no bones were broken.

A distributor of pills in Ludlow, said to be from outside the town, was arrested last week for breaking the law in that respect. The case was nolle prossed, as the man claimed not to know there was a law against such distribution.

Frank Moran, employed in the Boston Dairy company's plant in Bellows Falls, was working in the elevator a few days ago, when it dropped one floor and let several boxes of condensed milk fall upon him. Several ribs were fractured and one leg was broken.

Mildred Pinney, an Andover girl, was kicked over and under the eye by a young colt, which she was trying to catch, and the gashes required several stitches.

The power construction company which built the big dam at Somerset, is planning to build another big dam in the Deerfield valley and to that end is con-

structing an electric railroad from Hoosac tunnel to transport materials, thereby saving largely from what it would have to pay the steam railroad in freight charges.

Can't Find Road Destroyer.

Although the authorities have made every effort possible, no evidence has been secured as to the identity of the person who either through malicious, criminal intention or because of insanity last fall tore holes in a 50 foot stretch of the fine state road which had at that time just been completed between Rutland and Pittsford, near the O. J. Maigne farm.

The road was constructed at great pains and when completed was about the most nearly perfect piece of highway in that section. For this reason it was a popular speedway for motor driven vehicles. Shortly after a slight accident, in which an automobile was involved, very soon after the completion of the roadway, the residents of the section discovered one morning that the road had been ruined. Some sharp tool, evidently a pick, had been used to dig through the surface of the road in as many as six or eight places, at spaces a few feet apart. Temporary repairs were made, the excavations being filled with loose material, but this works out and the road is now in far from good condition.

The road commissioners of the town of Pittsford, where the strip of highway is located, reported the matter to State Highway Commissioner Charles W. Gates of Franklin but that officer and the authorities of both the city of Rutland and the county, have so far been unable to connect any person with the despoliation.
