Topics of the Home and Household.

To remove ink stains from the fingers, dip a sulphur match into water and rub it on the stain.

Sandwich-making may be simplified by removing the paper from a baking power can and using the can, not the cover, for cutting.

If a glass stopper will not come out, tap around it with another glass stopper and see how quickly it becomes loosened.

A pretty birthday cake may be made by using an angel cake mould for baking.

If plastering is broken on the wall or ceiling, take an old window shade or a piece of heavy material of any kind, paste over the hole, then cover with wall paper to match that already on the wall.

When meals must be kept warm take a hot baking pan and half fill it with hot water; then set in it some covered bowls containing the various articles of food and put the pan in a moderately hot oven.

When a valuable piece of music begins wearing out along the edges, you will be able to preserve it much longer if you bind the ragged edges with passe-partout binding.

To mend graniteware take a small piece of putty and press in the hole. Smooth off and set in a hot oven until it is brown.

You should never clean old faces with gasoline as so often recommended, for this very good reason: gasoline being naturally a grease remover, takes the natural oil from the face threads, which are a vegetable product, and renders them crisp, stiff and liable to crack.

Chocolate cake—Cream one cup of sugar with one cup of butter. Sift three times one heaping cup flour, one-half teaspoonful soda and two tablespoonfuls cocoa.

Deviled Fish—Take a large fish and wash. Cut open along the backbone and remove all the fish from the skin and chop fine.

Turkish Delight—One package of quickly dissolving gelatin soaked in three-quarters of a cup of cold water (about three minutes); juice of one lemon on an orange, two cups of sugar. Boil hard 20 minutes.

Marshmallow Pudding—One-half pound marshmallows, one cup heavy cream, one-fourth cup of candied cherries, one-half cup of English walnut meats, two tablespoonfuls of powdered sugar.

Parrot Fritters—Wash, scrape and quarter parsnips. Cook in boiling water until soft. Mash and season with salt and pepper.

Turkish Rice—Wash and drain one-half cup of rice. Cook in one tablespoonful of butter until brown, then add one-half cup of boiling water and steam until soft.
