

FULL ACCORD IS REACHED BY THE ALLIES

Great Britain and France Are in Complete Harmony as to Conduct of the War After Holding Conferences in Paris for Some Time

DISCUSSED QUESTIONS OF VITAL CHARACTER

Saloniki Despatches Declare That Reports of Teutonic or Bulgarian Arrival Near Greek Border Are Premature—Greek Troops Said to Be Planning Mobilization

Questions of urgent character relating to the conduct of the war were settled on a basis of complete understanding today at a conference of representatives of France and Great Britain.

Saloniki despatches declare the reports that German troops have reached Giervigli, close to the Greek border of Serbia, are premature, there being no sign of Teutonic or Bulgarian troops near that town up to a late hour yesterday.

Only artillery engagements are reported on the western front with the exception of minor trench fighting in the Champagne region.

SMOOT INDICATES REPUBLICAN FIGHT ON WILSON PLAN
