Railroads In Battle With Huge Drifts

River early yesterday morning was outlaid at St. Johnsbury early this morning, and an extra crew sent to bring it to Newport.

Danville reports drifts from five to six feet in depth and a furious Lyndonville creamery truck passage. There were few teams that ventured to the creamery this morning, and the snow rollers are all out in an endeavor to clear the congested highways.

Concord reported about eighteen inches, and that the mail carriers had not all been able to complete their routes because of the drifts.

Around Wheelock village there was reported about a foot, while on the surrounding hills there was two feet. It was impossible to get through to the Union House. The Lyndonville creamery truck passed through on its way to its home station and was experiencing considerable difficulty. The driver stated that it had taken him three quarters of an hour to go two miles and that he encountered

STRIKE ON SHOE COMPANY DECLARED ILLEGAL
HAVERHILL, Mass., Dec. 29.—The strike declared at the Knight Bros. shoe factory by members of the shoe workers protective union, was declared illegal today by Judge Keating in superior court. He enjoined union members from interfering with the business of the firm. The court found the union guilty of conspiring to force the firm to do business with them and influencing employees to violate terms of agreement between the firm and the boot and shoe workers union.

THIRD ONE OF BREWER FAMILY TO TAKE LIFE
ST. LOUIS, Dec. 29.—William J. Lemp, president of the William J. Lemp Breweries companies, committed suicide today shooting himself twice through the heart in the office of the brewery. It was the third suicide in the family of the famous brewers. His father and a sister having taken their own lives. The companies before the advent of prohibition was considered one of the largest brewing companies in the world. It was sold at auction last June. Lemp had been down east since, it was said.

N. E. Tied Up By Heavy Storm

knocking the forward truck off the rails. The wreckers worked for two hours before the tracks were cleared.

Street car traffic between this city and Danvers is badly tied up by the heavy storm.

BOSTON, Dec. 29.—New England early today was still in the grip of the storm which started yesterday and deposited an average of a foot of snow throughout the entire region. A northeast wind ranging from 50 to 70 miles an hour tied up all shipping along the coast and piled up huge drifts inland. Suburban trains and trolleys were kept running by constant use of plows, and all through trains were delayed.

NEW YORK, Dec. 29.—Thousands of volunteer show handlers were called to the shovels today to help dig New York city out of its first big snowstorm of the season. The storm took its toll of hundreds of injured from early last evening until daybreak. Ambulances were bringing to hospitals pedestrians with broken arms, fractured legs and cracked skulls who had fallen on the ice covered streets. It is reported that at least two were killed in falls.

The wind and snow worked havoc with the power and Tel. lines and street car transmission lines. Many pedestrians were endangered by snow falling from buildings, falling signs and chimneys. Losses running into the thousands of dollars were believed to have been sustained on Long Island and Staten Island when numerous small craft were washed ashore.
