### WOMEN WORKERS ORDERED TO TIFLIS

#### Railway Traffic Virtually Suspended and Shipment of Relief Interrupted

Batum, Caucasus, May 5.—(By the Associated Press.)—All American women workers with the American commission for relief in the near east have been ordered to Tiflis by Colonel William N. Haskell, in charge of operations, as a result of the capture of Baku by the Russian bolsheviks. A few women engaged in relief work north of the Caucasus mountains have been sent here.

# JOHNSON LEAD NOW 156,899

## California Returns Nearly All in Increase Senator's Plurality

### WOOD'S PLURALITY 10,000 IN INDIANA

#### State Law Requires Majority Vote to Bind Delegates, Which Wood Hasn't

San Francisco, May 6.—Related returns from Tuesday's presidential preference election early to-day had increased to 156,899 the lead of the Senator Hiram W. Johnson group of delegates over the Herbert Hoover ticket.

### WOOD'S PLURALITY 10,000 IN INDIANA

#### But This Is Not Binding on the Delegates—State Law Requires Majority Vote to Secure This.

Indianapolis, May 6.—Major General Leonard Wood with a total of 81,514 votes, apparently is assured of a plurality of almost 10,000 over Senator Hiram Johnson of California, who has 72,432 on the face of unofficial returns from 3,183 precincts out of 2,387 in Indiana in Tuesday's primary election.

### CHARGED WITH PROFITEERING

Benson, former chief of naval operations, disclosed to-day in testimony before the Senate committee investigating the Sims-Daniels row.

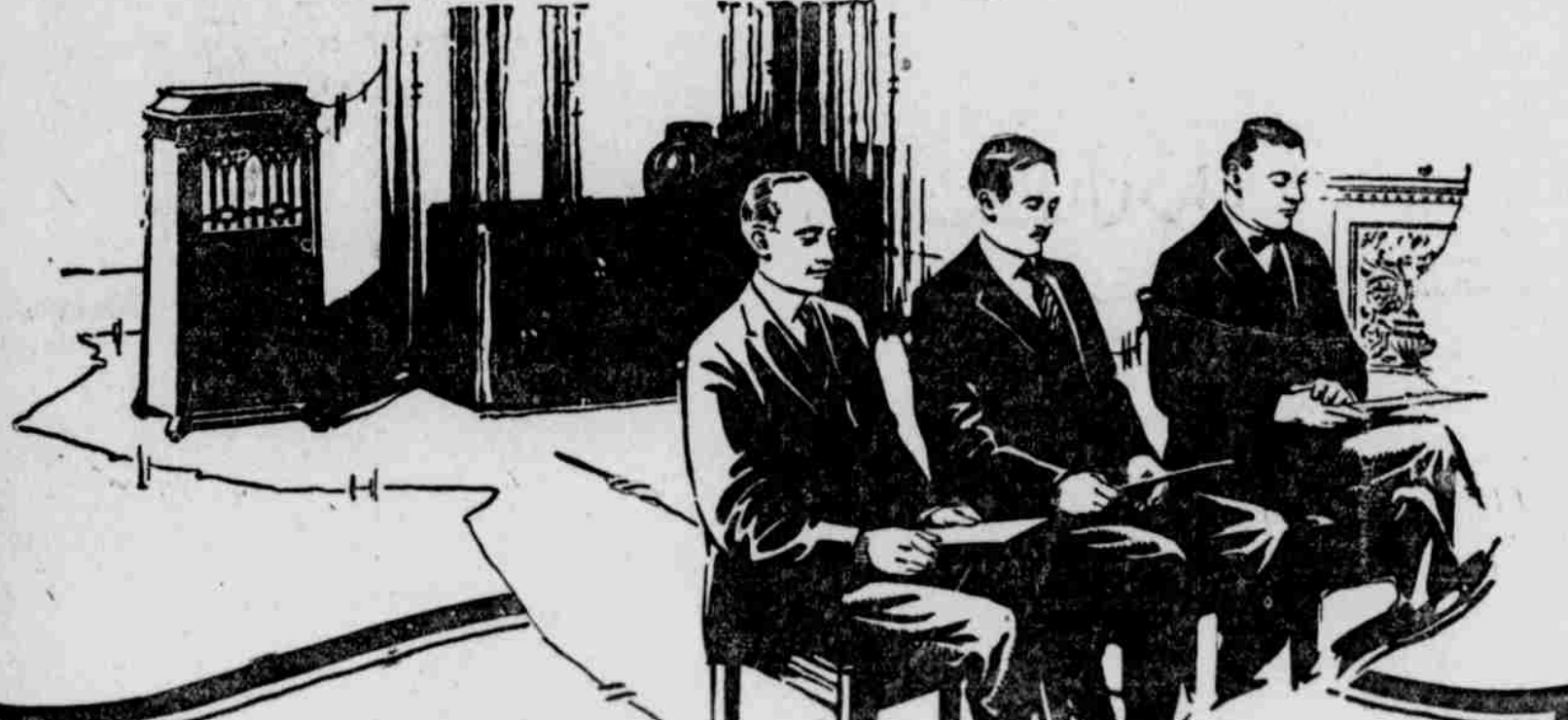
### MAGAZINE CIRCULATIONS DROP

#### High Cost of Paper Cause Many to Restrict Circulations.

Toronto, May 6.—Shipments of magazines from the United States to Toronto are from 54 to 61 tons less weekly than during normal distribution, as a result of the paper shortage in the United States, it was stated to-day. Several publications, which previously had wide circulation in Canada, have virtually discontinued shipments across the border.

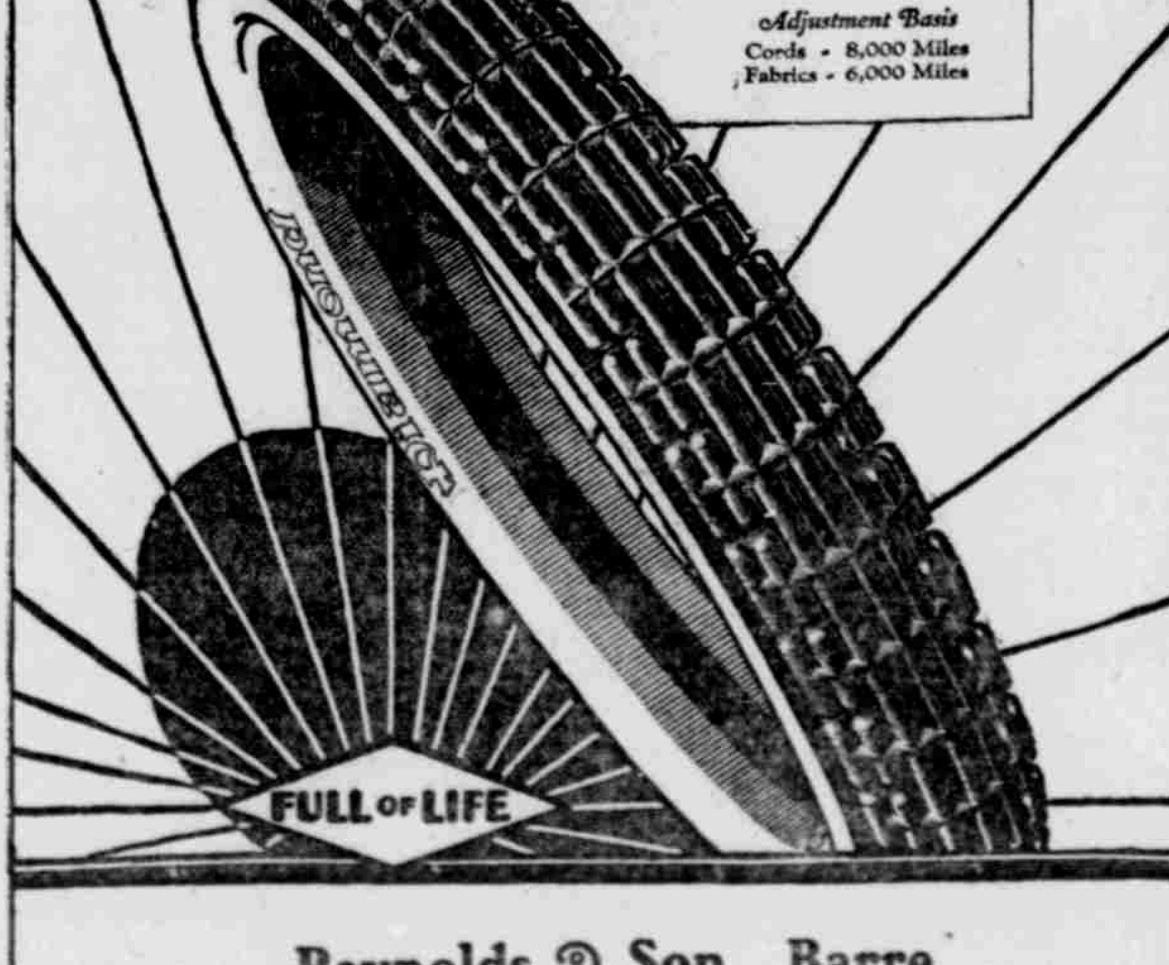
#### NOTIFIED TO RETURN TO WORK.
