NEW WORLD.

BURNED TO A CRISP.

A horrible burning accident took place last week at Lebanon, Pa., in which Miss Edna Behm, the fourteen-year-old daughter of Rudolph Behm, of North Anville, was cremated.

NATURAL GAS AT ITHACA, N. Y.

Natural gas was struck in the heart of the village of Ithaca, N. Y., Monday while a well was being driven for water.

The last battle of Calamar, Columbia, reported to be a government success, was not so. The slaughter was nearly equal on both sides.

THE JERSEY FOREST FIRES.

The Jersey forest fires are now assuming most alarming proportions, and unless a heavy rain soon quenches the flames they will destroy many small towns in Camden, Burlington and Atlantic counties.

Another strike is feared on the Wabash road. The Springfield, Ill., knights of labor sympathize with the strikers and will sustain them.

SEVEN TRAIN HANDS KILLED BY AN ACCIDENT. At Suwanee, Ga., on the Richmond and Danville railroad, a ditch train ran over a cow, throwing one car from the track.

Walt Whitman suffered from an attack of sunstroke at his home in Camden, N. J., last week; he is now recovering, but complains of his head.

A fire in Cardenas, Cuba, Thursday of last week burned the entire business part of the city and a vast quantity of sugar and molasses. The warehouses burned were those of Arce, Zulueta, Ferrer and Fantony.

The revolution in Venezuela is increasing. The towns of Carabobo, Trujillo, Cumana and Barcelona are in arms; also the states of Virginia and Andes.

Influenza capitalists are endeavoring to divide Dakota on the Missouri river and Montana north and south at the east end of Bozeman tunnel. This would make Dakota an agricultural state, and leave a cattleman's state west of it.

OLD WORLD.

The cholera epidemic is gradually making its way toward Portugal, and there is apparently nothing to impede its course. The sanitary cordons have proved ineffectual, and the scourge has appeared at Cordova, Gerona and Lerida.

A fire at Resh, Persia, has burned 712 shops. Two persons perished in the flames.

An earthquake has occurred in the Rungpur district, in Bengal. A village near Natore was engulfed.

There has been a terrific storm at Torre Cajetan, in Italy. Thirteen persons were killed and 24 injured by lightning.

Two buildings in Cologne, Germany, occupied by sixteen families, collapsed Friday. Several persons were killed and many injured.

A FEARFUL WAVE OF HEAT NOW EXTENDS OVER THE whole of the United Kingdom. In London the effects of the long spell of torrid weather are appalling.

The committee of inquiry into the revelations of immorality made by the Pall Mall Gazette sat four hours at London Friday sifting the evidence offered by the staff on that paper.

The Batignolles quarter of Paris was visited by a severe fire Friday evening. The conflagration occurred in a district occupied by carpet warehouses, carpenter shops and other workshops of various kinds, and was not extinguished until the buildings, covering five blocks, had been destroyed.

THE MURDER OF THE SHEPHERDS IN IRELAND.

David Duane, recently arrested for complicity in a triple murder at a farm house near Castletown, Roche county, Cork, in October, 1877, has made a full confession of his knowledge of this crime. He says that as an unwilling witness of the deed he saw William Sheehan and his brother-in-law, David Brown, kill the former's mother, sister and brother-in-law, a cooper's adze being used to do the work.

Said Pasha, the grand vizier of Turkey, has had an apopleptic stroke and will probably be compelled to retire from office. His retirement will hasten an alliance with England.

A Papal consistory was held at Rome, Monday. Archbishop Moran, of Australia, Archbishop Melchior, of Cologne, Archbishop Capelatro, of Capua, Archbishop Battaglini, of Bologna, Bishop Schiavini, and Monsignor Cristofori were created Cardinals.

ANOTHER LONDON SCANDAL.

A great sensation is being caused in London by a prevalent scandal about a radical member of the house of commons and of the late cabinet. According to the story, this statesman, who is a widower, took to his private residence a few weeks ago the wife of another well-known London gentleman.

THE CHOLERA IN SPAIN.

The storms seem to have stayed the epidemic slightly, but it still rages in Saragossa. In some places distressing scenes are witnessed. Many bodies are buried. A majority of the inhabitants have fled and the remainder are incapable of attending to the sick.

The marriage of Princess Beatrice, the youngest daughter of Queen Victoria, to Prince Henry of Battenberg took place last week Thursday at St Mildred's church, Whippingham, six miles from Osborne. The bridal procession started from the palace at 1:15 o'clock.

Victor Lawrence of East St Johnsburg, amputated the two middle fingers on the left hand between the first and second joints while working in his mill one day last week.

INCENDIARISM BELIEVED TO BE THE WORK OF Nihilists. Incendiary fires have become very common in Russia, four occurring in Moscow Saturday, with enormous loss.
