IN HUB MARKETS.

Quotations on the Leading Products in Demand.

Boston, July 25.—Butter has been in rather better demand, on cooler weather, with the best creameries very well held.

Eggs are scarce and firm. The market is well supplied with stock that has been more or less heated by the recent hot weather.

Native cherries are about out of the market. Dealers say that there are few more to come forward.

Potatoes are easier, under full supply. Extra are quoted at \$2.50 per bushel; fair to good, \$2.25 to \$2.50.

Onions are pretty firm at \$2.25 per bushel for Egyptian, western, 80 per cent; native bunch, 25 per dozen.

Beets are sold at 50c per bushel, and at \$1.50 per 100 for bunch. Carrots are firmer at \$1.50 per bu. and at \$2.00 per 100 for bunch.

The mutton market is fairly steady, with a better trade ruling late in the week. Veals are in small supply, with a firmer market.

Hay is still dull. The abundant hay crop in nearly all parts of New England has sent a big volume of old hay to market.
