FOUND GUILTY OF ILLEGAL KILLING

Halifax Deer Shooting Case Going to County Court.

GEORGE CARRUTH RESPONDENT

Fined \$100 by Judge Daley for Killing a Deer Last February - Defence Claimed Animal Was Destroying the Apple Trees on H. R. Brown's Farm.

George Carruth of Halifax was found guilty Wednesday afternoon of shooting a deer illegally on the morning of Feb. 24, 1911, and sentenced by Judge W. R. Daley in municipal court to pay a fine of \$100 and costs.

When the case was first brought to the attention of the court with two companion cases Mr. Fitts claimed that the respondents could not sue upon the complaints then made but the supreme court decided that the cases could be so tried.

During the morning session Deputy Sheriff Frank L. Wellman of Guilford and County Game Warden M. J. Howard of South Londonderry testified to making an investigation of the shooting of the deer on Henry R. Brown's farm in Halifax last spring.

Both men to Brattleboro before trial. Carruth testified to visiting the home of Ossie Prouty where some of the deer meat was found. He told of his conversation with Henry R. Brown to shoot any deer found doing damage to apple trees on the Brown farm.

Henry R. Brown testified that he had ordered his men to kill any deer found doing damage to his apple trees. In response to a query by Attorney Fitts the witness said that he was back of the respondent Carruth and would take care of him as regards any penalty the court might impose.

E. B. Barrows, who said that he had 10 or 15 years' experience in apple growing, corroborated the testimony of Mr. Brown, stating that he had seen a number of young apple trees that he had seen damaged by deer and testified that he took the trees from his orchard shortly after the killing of the deer in question.

Mr. Fitts handed a roll of paper marked "Exhibit I." It purported to be a map according to the statement of the state's attorney but Attorney Fitts spoke of it as "that thing" and intimated that it was of little use in the case.

Pupils Sold Red Cross Stamps to the Amount of \$38.

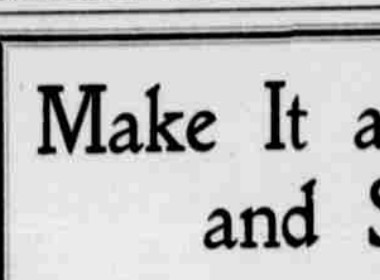
