Of the \$5,000,000,000 railroad bonds over one-half are payable in gold, and either wholesale default must be made or rates raised and wages reduced to provide double the sum now needed for interest.

If Bryan were elected the currency in circulation to-day, \$1,600,000,000, would shrink to \$550,000,000 at a blow. All the gold in circulation, in all July \$1,500,000,000, would instantly disappear and be at a premium of 200.

European Letter.

SEVILLE, Spain, June 7, 1896.

Some one has said that dancing is to Spain what music is to Italy. Young and old, fat and thin, they all dance whenever occasion presents itself. On days of festa the clicking of castanets and the pattering of feet are heard everywhere.

The church was dark—it was twilight, and only one chapel was illuminated. A crowd of kneeling women filled the aisles. A few priests stood around the altar, and before it were two rows of boys, about ten or twelve years of age, dressed in the Spanish costume of the middle ages, with tight and plumed hats.

The story is told that one of the former archbishops of Seville, who should evidently have been born in Puritanical days, objected to the dance as profane, and ordered that it be discontinued. This aroused such opposition, not only from the authorities of the cathedral but among the inhabitants of Seville, that the question was referred to the pope.

In every city, in every town, in the fields and on the trains, we see soldiers. The whole country seems to be in the army. Even boys are being drilled everywhere. The soldiers, however, have less of the military bearing than any we have seen in Europe.

Take Life As It Comes.

There is one sin which is everywhere, and by everybody is underestimated and quite too much overlooked in valuations of character. It is the sin of fretting.
