Eggs.—Receipts have been much larger than last week, but there has been a steady consumption demand and enough buying for storage to give the market a strong tone.

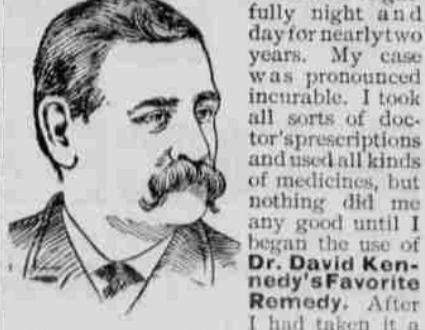
LIVESTOCK.
