12,000 Apple Trees Planted On Hill-sides of Four Farms

EVERYTHING DONE IN SCIENTIFIC WAY

Keeps Apple Trees Following Powder Keg Up Sides of Hills—Old Buildings Fitted for Employees—Allows No Fruit to Fall—Starts Storehouse. WESTMINSTER, Sept. 13.—A thousand pounds of dynamite a week for the two months just ending have put the finishing touches on Rocky Hill, and now a plan projected 10 years ago is completed with a 12,000 tree orchard—all apples.

Mr. Dascomb has placed all his fruit into one basket and his immense harvest—when it comes—will be almost entirely of one variety of apple. A farmer knows what this means. A white frost in blossom time may kill his chances of meeting the note at the bank in the fall. This year the frost came on May 9. In New England orchards where there should be 20,000 barrels this fall there will not be more than 2,000. 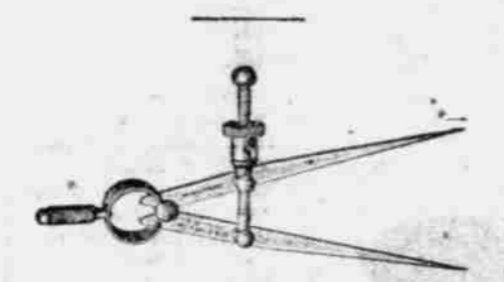
