WALL STREET

WALL STREET, N. Y., Dec. 30—Virtually all groups of stocks moved to higher levels in today's brief session of the market, the last of the year. Wide-spread predictions of business prosperity during the coming year and Secretary Hughes' suggestion of an international conference of financiers to settle the reparations problem had a cheering effect. An advance in Pennsylvania crude oil prices was reflected in a brisk demand for the oil shares. Some of the other conspicuous advance spots were Standard Oil of California, Houston Oil, Chicago and Northwestern, Continental Can, Bosch Magneto, Stromberg Carlsrudetor and Du Pont, all up 2 to 4 points. New peak prices for the year were established by Endicott Johnson, North American and Stewart Warner Speedometer, the gains ranging from 1 1/2 to 4 points. The closing was strong. Sales approximated 500,000.
