He Deprecates Overmuch Hairsplitting Theology—A Good Man, a Good Woman, the Best Arguments in Behalf of Christianity—The Power of Prayer.

BROOKLYN, Sept. 16.—Rev. Dr. Talmage, who is still absent on his round the world tour, has selected as the subject of his sermon through the press for today "Holy Compulsion," the text being Luke xiv, 23, "And compel them to come in."


and give him my Christian love." This worldly doctor came home after awhile, and the message was given to him, and he said within himself, "What does he mean by leaving his Christian love for me?"
