

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS.

THE NEW ORLEANS MURDERERS.—Gen. Grant, it will be remembered issued an order some months since directing the commander of the Department of the Gulf, in cases where the civil authorities refused to arrest and bring to justice persons charged with the commission of crimes, to arrest and hold such criminals as prisoners until the civil authorities would consent to bring them to justice.

People began to ask a good while ago. Why are not these assassins and rioters arrested? We now have an answer. A late telegram from New Orleans informs us that the President ordered Gen. Sheridan not to arrest these red handed murderers of Union men, and to totally disregard Gen. Grant's order in the premises.

This is in keeping with the President's whole course relative to the New Orleans massacre. The assassins were his friends and supporters. The murdered men were Unionists and consequently his enemies. Most of their murderers were ex-rebel soldiers, and Andrew Johnson has pardoned too many rebels for murders committed by them during the rebellion to hesitate about protecting them in the same murderous business now, and more especially as they now are all numbered among his staunchest supporters, while the murdered men were his political enemies.

In reply to a resolution of the House of Representatives calling upon the Secretary of War for the number of prisoners on either side held, and that died during the war, the following report is made: Number of Union prisoners South, 260,940; number of Confederate prisoners North, 200,000; number of Union prisoners died, 22,576; number of Confederate prisoners died, 26,438. According to the above, one Confederate prisoner died out of 8 sent North; while of the Federal prisoners sent south only 1 died out of 12."

The above erroneous statement, given by the Washington Star, and which is now going the rounds of the Democratic papers, is calculated to deceive the people.

The exact number of deaths among the Union soldiers in the rebel prisons never will be known, but it is probably nearer forty thousand than the above estimate. Dr. Hamlin says in "Martyria," "Of the number of Federal soldiers who have been held in captivity during the rebellion by the rebels, more than thirty thousand of them are now dead." We know from official record that twenty-three thousand are buried at Andersonville and Salisbury alone. Besides these two prisons are to be reckoned Belle Isle, Libby and Danville, in Virginia, Wilmington and Raleigh in North Carolina, Florence, Columbia and Charleston in South Carolina, Miles, Thomasville and Macon in Georgia, and the prisoners in Alabama, Louisiana and Texas.

Infantry, which is stationed at Fort Dodge. The prisoners all belonged to one family, and at the time they were taken by the Indians were returning from a visit to some sick relatives, and were but a few miles from home when captured and captured. In the melee that ensued the head of the family, James Box, was killed and scalped. The remaining members of the family were immediately placed on animal and hurried to the haunts of the savages. In the haunts of this relentless foe the child fell from the arms of its mother, while the Indians were gazing the worn out animals that carried her. It was crushed to death among the rocks, the mother not being allowed to dismount and see it. The mother and the two eldest daughters were subjected to the most unheard of cruelty and outrages, and the youngest child, unable to understand the commands of her fiendish task-masters, was placed upon live coals till she was roasted. When rescued she had almost forgotten her mother tongue. Altogether they were in captivity about ten weeks.
