

EAST CLEANS UP WESTERN TEAMS

MIGHTY MICHIGAN TEAM MET CRUSHING DEFEAT BY PENNSYLVANIA—YOST'S AGGRESSION WAS OUT CLASS—ED AT EVERY POINT OF THE GAME.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Nov. 19.—Mighty Michigan has fallen. Outplayed, outgeneraled, outkicked, and outclassed, the erstwhile mighty Wolverines were dragged down to a 17 to 6 defeat here Saturday by Pennsylvania, generally regarded as the joke of the season among Eastern football spectators. The score was the big surprise of the season, biggest possibly victims.

A Last Struggle. It was when all hopes of victory were gone that Michigan made her luckiest fight—not to win; it was too late for that, but to score—to save herself from the fate which she has dealt to so many luckless opponents.

Michigan was confident. True, the team was generally regarded as the weakest that had won in the maize and blue in years. But it was Yost's team. It was "Michigan." The name itself carried weight, and a record of years unfurnished by defeat commanded respect. Saturday it was different.
