Bya Branch of the Baltimore and Ohio, as well as on the South Penn route. If the road is constructed the Baltimore and Ohio will have a line that crosses the Alleghenies at the lowest possible grade and considerably lower than the present line of the Baltimore and Ohio across the mountains. It is said that if a railroad is constructed on this line it would make the Baltimore and Ohio, with other improvements it is making west of Pittsburg, a lower-graded line between Tidewater and Chicago than any of the other trunk lines except the lake roads. It would also be an important factor in shortening the distance between Baltimore and Pittsburg by about 50 miles.

Valuable Charter Rights. Valuable charter rights, rights of way for miles of partly completed roadbed and tunnels partly finished were secured by the Baltimore and Ohio when the old South Penn was bought. The incomplete road is a relic of the war between great railroad systems of the East for lines connecting them with the vast freight-producing territory of the West. It was started by the Vanderbilts, who control the New York Central, and a sum estimated as high as \$10,000,000 was spent on its construction. The work was stopped years ago, being one of the conditions of the sale of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company of the Lake Shore to the New York Central. The Vanderbilts originally intended bringing the line into Baltimore by a traffic agreement and connection with the Western Maryland Railroad at Chambersburg Pa.

Since the deal with the Pennsylvania, years ago, the South Penn has lain idle, with roadbed practically ready for laying track and tunnels to carry the road under mountain spurs partly bored. The Pennsylvania bought the Lake Shore to retaliate for the Vanderbilts attempting to enter its territory with the South Penn.

The eastern end of the South Penn line from Bedford to Chambersburg was purchased by the Pennsylvania Railroad company some years ago through a foreclosure sale.

Surveyors are now at work on a proposed trolley line, beginning at Hollidaysburg and to run to Bedford, ending at Cumberland. The line, if built, will connect Cumberland with Altoona, a line already being in operation between the latter place and Hollidaysburg. The route to Cumberland is by way of the Bedford Springs and the Cumberland Valley.

TO BAR NEGRO FROM ARMY

TEXAS CONGRESSMAN CLASSES THE RACE WITH HOSTILE INDIANS.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—Negroes are forever excluded from service in the army of the United States by a bill which was introduced in the House yesterday by Representative Slayden, of Texas. The bill provides that on or before the 30th day of June, 1907, all enlisted men of the army who are negroes or of negro descent shall be discharged from the service of the United States, and, thereafter, no negro or person of negro descent shall be enlisted or appointed in the army of the United States.

In explaining his bill, Mr. Slayden said: "The bill speaks for itself. My purpose is to give the Congress of the United States an opportunity to purge the army of an admittedly dangerous element. To say that the negroes are brave is not an argument against this measure. Many men have been brave, in fact most men are in the matter of fighting."

"The Comanche and Sioux Indians were as brave as men can be. But no one would seriously suggest that we ultimately recruit regiments from them, put guns in their hands, and station them near companies of white troops toward whom they entertain inherent race-hostility. The Twenty-fifth infantry is manifestly imbued with the same race hostility, and events have shown it to be quite as dangerous as the Sioux or Comanches would be."

Wheeling Man

FOUND DEAD ON RAILROAD TRACK IN INDIANA AND MURDER IS SUSPECTED.

LAPORTE, Ind., Dec. 6.—The decapitated body of James Dearmond, whose residence is supposed to be in Wheeling, was found lying beside the Pan Handle railroad track at Star City. Believing that the dead man was sandbagged and placed on the track to hide a murder, the authorities are trying to locate his brother Charles, in West Virginia. The victim had been robbed and the place where his body was found was remote from any point where there was any likelihood of his going. His death was discovered when a girl walking along the tracks stumbled over his head.
