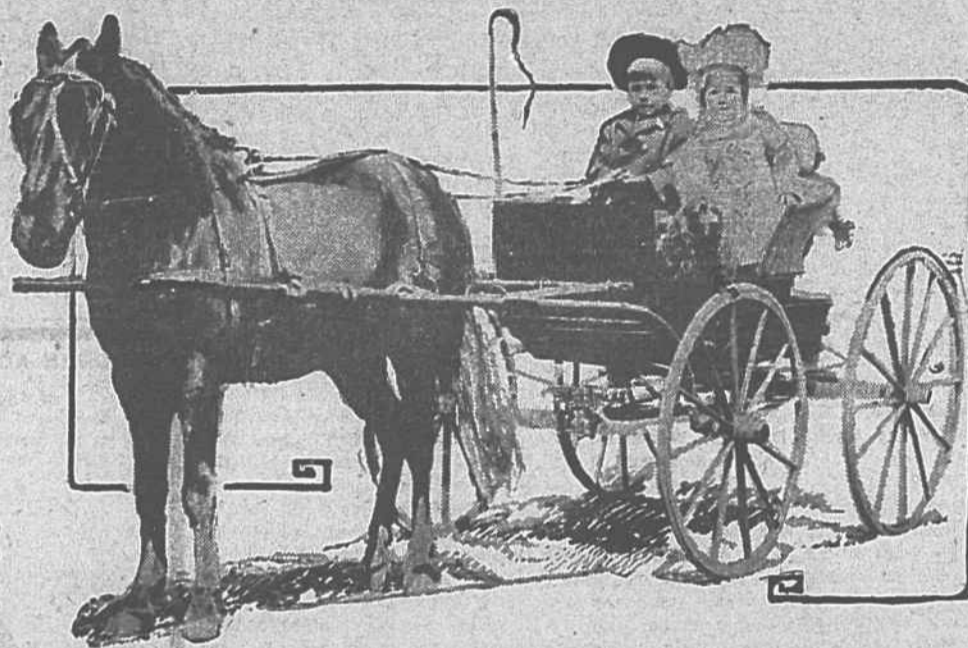

Conditions of the Contest

Rules and Regulations

Any boy, girl, or lady, will be eligible to enter the contest.

No certificate will be issued for less than one dollar payment on subscription to the Daily or Semi-Weekly.

At the close of the contest the votes will be canvassed by a committee of competent business men in the presence of the contestants and their friends and the public.

The balloting will begin with the issue of Saturday, July 27, and close promptly at 6 p. m. Saturday, August 31, 1907.

No employe or immediate member of their family or of the family of any stockholder in the West Virginian will be permitted to compete in the contest.

In the event of a tie for any of the prizes the value of the same will be divided between the parties making the tie or a premium of equal value will be given to each, at the option of the paper.

Candidates and others sending subscriptions and votes must plainly state whether or not they are old or new subscribers.

Votes are not transferrable and if any candidate drops out of the race their votes will not be counted for another candidate.
