Attorneys in the Federal Court. Inasmuch as the Federal Court for this district will shortly be in session in this city, we deem it not inopportune time to bring to the attention of that tribunal, as well as of the general public, the law of Congress requiring attorneys before practicing in the United States Courts to take the oath prescribed by Congress to officers of the United States; which is similar to that required of officers in this State.

For the information of any who may feel an interest in the "enforcement of the laws," we reproduce both the law requiring the oath of attorneys, and that prescribing it. We copy from the U. S. Statutes at large, 2d Session, 32d Cong., p. 424:

CHAPTER XX. An Act supplementary to an act entitled "An Act to prescribe an oath of office, and for other purposes," approved July two, eighteen hundred and sixty-two.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, That no person after the date of this act shall be admitted to the bar of the Supreme Court of the United States, or at any time after the fourth of March next, shall be admitted to the bar of any Circuit or District Court of the United States, or of the Court of Claims, as an attorney or counselor of such courts, or shall be allowed to appear in any court in any such court, by virtue of any previous admission, or any special power of attorney, unless he shall have first taken and subscribed the oath prescribed in "An Act to prescribe an oath of office, and for other purposes," approved July two, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, and sixty-two, according to the forms and in the manner in the said act provided; which said oath so taken and subscribed shall be preserved among the files of such court, and any person who shall falsely take the said oath shall be guilty of perjury, and shall be liable to the pains and penalties of perjury, and the additional pains and penalties in the said act provided.

Approved, January 24, 1865.

The following is the Act referred to in the foregoing. We copy from the Acts and Resolutions of the second session Thirty-seventh Congress, (printed by order of the Senate,) p. 210: CHAPTER XXXVII. An Act to prescribe an Oath of Office and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That hereafter every person elected or appointed to any office of honor or profit under the government of the United States, either in the civil, military, or naval departments of the public service, excepting the President of the United States, shall, before entering upon the duties of such office, and before being entitled to any of the salary or other emoluments thereof, take and subscribe the following oath or affirmations: "I, B. B. B., do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I have never voluntarily borne arms against the United States since I have been a citizen thereof; that I have voluntarily given no aid, countenance, counsel or encouragement to persons engaged in armed hostility thereto; that I have neither sought nor accepted nor attempted to exercise the functions of any office whatever under any authority or pretended authority in hostility to the United States; that I have neither sworn (or affirmed) that I will support and defend the constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I will take this obligation freely without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter, so help me God."

Letter to Gov. Pierpont Concerning the Matter of Pardons. NEW YORK, Sept. 3.—The following letter, addressed to the Governor of Virginia, has been furnished for publication:

ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE, WASHINGTON, August 27, 1865.—To Hon. F. H. Pierpont, Governor of Virginia: Sir, I am directed by the Attorney General to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 6th inst., and to say, in reply, that as far as this office is concerned, you have his full authority for saying that the only influence possible to be exerted in the matter of pardons by any agent, or attorney, or lawyer, he may be, is to delay the petition. All cases coming under the thirteenth exception, and all civil officers having your recommendation, need nothing further. They are approved by the Attorney General as a matter of course.
