SUNDAY ADDRESSES FEDERAL EMPLOYEES

WHILE UNEXPECTED, VISIT WAS HIGHLY APPRECIATED.

Postmaster Hazlett, Quickly Arranged for the Meeting in the Carriers' Room.

The employees of the Postoffice Department and of the offices in the Federal building were yesterday at noon honored with a visit from Rev. Mr. Sunday and Chorister Rodeheaver. The call was unexpected, but was none the less appreciated by the employees, all of whom enjoyed the interesting address of Mr. Sunday and the songs of Mr. Rodeheaver.

Entering the postoffice building at 12 o'clock, Rev. Mr. Sunday and Mr. Rodeheaver met Postmaster Hazlett, and arrangements were quickly made for a meeting to be held in the carriers' room of the postoffice department.

With the exception of a few clerks, the entire office force and the employees of the United States Engineer's office and other offices on the second and third floors of the building assembled in this room, and to an audience of nearly a hundred persons the noted evangelist spoke for at least fifteen minutes.

God and the Employer.

Pointing out the difference between right and wrong, Rev. Mr. Sunday spoke along the lines of work in the department, illustrating his address with several well taken arguments. He stated that serving God was like serving your employer. While you serve your employer to the best of your ability, things will be all right; but if you do not serve your employer, then things will go wrong. In the same manner, if you serve God everything will be all right, but if it is wrong to serve the devil. To serve God best, he said, one should love God as one does an employer.

Chorister Rodeheaver entertained the audience for nearly ten minutes with songs and a number of trombone solos, winning merited applause. Among other hymns, Mr. Rodeheaver rendered No. 32, and the entire audience sang the chorus. The employees of the building were unanimous in expressing their appreciation of the visit, and both Mr. Sunday and Mr. Rodeheaver were well pleased with the reception.

In the afternoon the clerks in the postoffice presented Mr. Sunday with an immense basket of fruit, and in the evening all who possibly could, nearly forty in all, attended the meeting at the tabernacle in a body.
