Many Wheeling fans went to Pittsburgh yesterday where they witnessed two exciting games between Pittsburgh and New York. Many others are planning to go today, when the same teams play another double-header.

Oil and Gas

In the lower Southwest fields of West Virginia, the Blue creek development has increased its output materially both by the completion of two new good wells and the cleaning out and shooting of a number of the old producing wells located on the farms controlled by the larger companies.

The South Penn Oil Company has completed its No. 4 well on the U. C. Myers farm, located on the western side of Finch creek, in Elk district, Kanawha county, and about 630 feet west of the same company's third test on this farm, and it produced 450 barrels in the first 24 hours.

The South Penn Oil Company's No. 5 well on the Fred Gardner farm, located on Finch creek, in the same district and county, is completed in the same sand and is showing a 50-barrel per day production from that formation.

In the Spencer field the South Penn Oil company has completed its No. 8 well on the Lucy J. Webb farm, located in Smithfield district, Boone county, through the Big Injun sand, and it is showing for a 10-barrel per day production. This location is 500 feet west of the same company's No. 7, on this farm.

In Marion district, Marion county, the well on the Nancy Brown farm, which was completed in the fifth sand and filled up 2,500 feet with fluid, was given a shot in the 30-foot and Big Injun sands and will not make better than a 2-barrel per day producer from all sands.

The Boone Development company has completed its No. 9 well on the David Simmons farm, located in Smithfield district, Boone county, and it is showing for a 10-barrel per day production from the Big Injun sand. This location is 500 feet west of the same company's No. 8 well, on this farm.
