STATE GAME ASSOCIATION CLOSE ANNUAL MEETING

Special Feature to the Intelligencer. FAIRMONT, W. Va., Dec. 5.—The annual meeting of the West Virginia Fish and Game Association came to a close here tonight with an elaborate hotel reception, dinner, mountain trout and other delicacies of the field and stream formed the menu.

At a business meeting this morning the endorsing of the officers were chosen by the association for the ensuing year.

President, J. A. Vignoney of Belington, secretary and treasurer, H. B. Rector of Huntington.

The committee of legislation, composed of Charles S. Dice, J. O. McNeel, J. Phillips, J. B. Hanlan and Andrew Price was named to make efforts to secure better fish and game laws in the state.

There were 225 new members secured at the session just closed in this city. Of this number one half were from Marion county.

At the sessions today many well known sportsmen delivered addresses among them James H. Samson, editor of the Open of Pittsburgh, Philip S. Barnham of the National Association with headquarters in New York city was present today and addressed the organization.

Before adjournment the association passed a set of resolutions asking the state to enact better laws and take greater efforts towards the protection of state forests, fish and game.
