Drops into City on Business, and Will Be Here Tomorrow and Vote Against New Charter.
Ex-Senator N. B. Scott is spending a few days in the city, and while here will cast his vote at the special session to be held Tuesday on the new charter. In conversation with an Intelligence reporter last evening in the McLure Hotel, he stated that he came to the city on a business mission and would remain here until Tuesday evening, when he will leave for a day or so, to return later in the week to spend a few days.

IN SECLUSION
"Pop" Shipman, Charged With Post-office Robberies, Not Allowed to Talk With Friends.
Clyde "Pop" Shipman, the Martins Ferry man who was arrested by Deputy United States Marshall Elzta Williams Friday evening, will be held in the county jail until federal court convenes in Martinsburg, April 1, when he will be given a preliminary hearing, and later, if held, will be taken to Columbus, O. In that city he will be given a trial before the United States court on a charge of robbing or being implicated in the robbery of several local post-offices, it is said.
While confined in the Ohio county jail he will be denied the privilege of seeing any visitors, and will be kept secluded, so far as possible, so that none of his alleged accomplices will have an opportunity to get to him.
