DECIDED UPWARD TENDENCY NOTICED ON THE NEW YORK MARKET YESTERDAY

NEW YORK, June 18.—While there was some irregularity in movements of stocks today, the tendency continued upward. Speculative sentiment remained as cheerful as it has been since the rebound in prices last week, and although the demand for stocks was not pressing, there was a ready market for such offerings as were made. Conservatism prevailed on both sides of the market. In spite of the evidence that the market had been completed, and the latest one, bull operators were not inclined to tempt ambitious undertakings. In view of the many uncertainties of the present situation, on the other hand, traders on the short side, impressed by the better tone of the market and the evidence that heavy liquidation has been completed, acted with caution. In view of these conditions, it was regarded as natural that there should be a slowing down in speculation.
