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THE TRENTON MONUMENT. Unveiling of the Shaft Commemorating the Famous Battle.

TRENTON, N. J., Oct. 19.—Promptly at 12:30 to-day the procession of the troops, governors and invited guests started for the monument.

The reviewing stand was erected in front of the county court house, on Broad street, and here, after the ceremonies at the monument, the procession was reviewed by Governor Werts.

After a selection by the Seventh regiment band, William S. Stryker, president of the association, came forward and introduced Bishop Starkey, of New York, who invoked the divine blessing on this auspicious occasion.

General Stryker then made the opening address, and was followed by many well known and prominent men.

Thus it is that New York's two most distinguished citizens, President Cleveland and Governor Flower, were invited to be present at the dedication and, in addition the West Point cadets were asked to attend and New Jersey, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Pennsylvania paraded the flower of their national guard.
